“Student of the Year”

2020 Award: \$2,000

The Glenville Rotary annually recognizes one graduating high school student who will attend a four-year college and exemplifies the ideals of Rotary's motto: “Service Above Self.” The successful candidate must live within the Town of Glenville which includes Scotia, Alplaus and a portion of Burnt Hills.

This award seeks to recognize the successful students' contributions to family, peers, school, and the greater community. The award also recognizes achievements in academics, in-school clubs and organizations, as well as in out-of-school organizations and activities. Finally, the Student of the Year Award committee also seeks to determine the potential of the student to make additional contributions to our society in the future or the advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through world fellowship.

Qualifications:

1. Resident of the Town of Glenville, including Villages of Scotia and Alplaus and some areas within the Burnt Hills zip code.
2. May be graduating from a public, private or parochial high school, or home schooled.
3. Either attending (i) a two- or four-year public or private college (\$2,000 award), or (ii) an accredited institution of higher or technical trade learning (\$1,000 award).
4. Extra-curricular activities and community service must evidence an active commitment to volunteerism or international awareness.
5. The successful applicant will have an academic record which reflects a commitment to his or her field of study.
6. Two letters of recommendation are required.
7. Applicant may be self-nominated or nominated by school faculty.
