The Charles Lindholm Award is for Glenville residents interested in furthering their education. Students planning to pursue an associate's degree in any field are encourage to apply. Additionally, students planning a course of study in a preprofessional or vocational program are encouraged to apply. For example, students for this award might be interested in preparing for careers in fields such as, but not limited to, culinary, paralegal, emergency management, fire protection and building trades. The planned program should culminate in a degree and/or certificate.

The successful applicant will:

- a) live within the Town of Glenville, including Scotia and Alplaus.
- b) be able to describe how they will benefit from the planned course of study
- c) anticipate where they will work after completing the program
- d) exemplify the ideals of Rotary's motto: "Service Above Self."

This award seeks to recognize the successful students' contributions to family, peers, school, and the greater community. The award also recognizes achievements in academics, in-school clubs and organizations, as well as in out-of-school organizations and activities. Finally, the Student of the Year Award committee also seeks to determine the potential of the student to make additional contributions to our society in the future or the advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through world fellowship.

Qualifications:

- 1. Resident of the Town of Glenville, including Villages of Scotia and Alplaus and some areas within the Burnt Hills zip code.
- 2. May be graduating from or has already graduated from a public, private or parochial high school, home schooled, or GED.
- 3. Either attending (i) a two-year college or (ii) an accredited institution of higher or technical trade learning (\$1,000 award).
- 4. Extra-curricular activities and community service must evidence an active commitment to volunteerism or international awareness. Examples of volunteer activities may include, Girl or Boy Scouts, GIVE, JROTC, City Mission, ARC.
- 5. The successful applicant will have a background which reflects a commitment to his or her field of study.
- 6. Two letters of recommendation are required.
- 7. Applicant may be self-nominated.
